AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 11.68, ENTITLED "HONORARY STREETS," OF TITLE 11, ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," OF THE WESTCHESTER MUNICIPAL CODE IN ORDER TO DESIGNATE "JERRY & IRENE SPAHN FAMILY WAY" WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF WESTCHESTER

WHEREAS, Jerry and Irene Spahn resided on the 1400 block of Newcastle Avenue for 65 years, during which time they raised their four children: Tom, Dave, Mary and Barb; and

WHEREAS, Jerry and Irene Spahn have greatly contributed to the growth of the Village of Westchester, as local business owners of C.P. Spahn and Associates Insurance Company and as parishioners helping to build Divine Infant Church; and

WHEREAS, Jerry Spahn served the Village of Wetchester as the President of the Hillside/Westchester Rotary Club and as a member of the Westchester Chamber of Commerce, for which he was honored as a lifetime member in 2011; and

WHEREAS, Jerry and Irene Spahn have provided philanthropic support for the community through their generous donations to the construction of the Veterans Memorial located at the Westchester Park District and to the scholarship funds of St. Joseph's High School and Immaculate Heart of Mary High School; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village of Westchester desire to honor Jerry and Irene Spahn for their dedication and service to the Village of Westchester, by designating a portion of Newcastle Avenue, as "Jerry & Irene Spahn Way".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Westchester, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Section 11.68.010, entitled "Honorary Streets – Designated," of Chapter 11.68, entitled "Honorary Streets," of Title 11, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended as follows:

Chapter 11.68 HONORARY STREETS

11.68.010 Honorary Streets - Designated.

The following streets are designated as honorary streets:

- (a) Honorable John J. Sinde Drive, on Mayfair Avenue, from 31st Street to Canterbury Street
- (b) Honorable Angelo L. Luciano Avenue, on Sunnyside Avenue, from 31st Street to Cermak Road
- (c) Honorable Frederick Wedinger Way, on Wakefield Street, from Wolf Road to Boeger Avenue
- (d) George Zanoni Way, on Becket Avenue, from Carlisle Street to 31st Street.
- (e) Coach Gene Pingatore Way, on Sherwood Avenue, from Robinhood Street to Windsor Drive
- (f) Barbara J. Bailey Way, on Nelson Square, from Nelson Street to Kingston Street.
- (g) Dr. Raymond Albert Way, on Windsor Drive, from Downing Avenue to Mayfair Avenue
- (h) Lucille Perry Way, on Newcastle Avenue, from Canterbury Street to Kent Street.
- (i) Tom & Colette Durkin Way, on Canterbury Street, from Balmoral Avenue to Mannheim Road.
- (j) William (Bill) Ernst Way, on Newcastle Avenue between Devonshire Street and Roosevelt Road.
- (k) Donald Devine Way, on Suffolk Avenue between Dover Street and Cermak Road.
- (1) Jerry and Irene Spahn Way, on Newcastle from Dickens Street to Chaucer Street.

Section 2. The Village's Public Works Director is hereby authorized and directed to install the appropriate honorary street signage for Jerry & Irene Spahn Way, on Newcastle Avenue, from Dickens Street to Chaucer Street.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.
